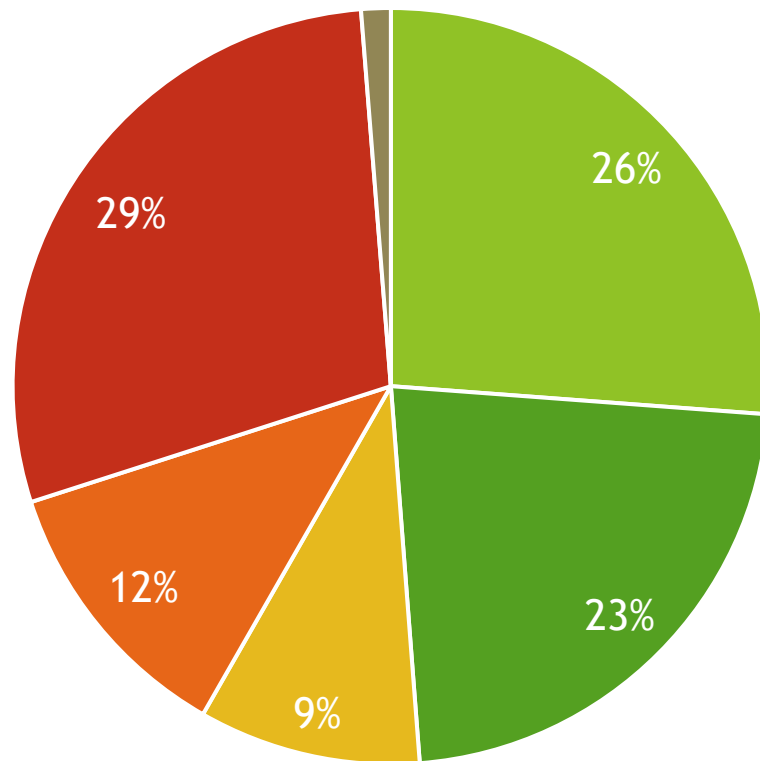

Master Plan Implementation Strategies

This survey was created in order to receive input from the community on the following implementation strategies identified by the East Longmeadow community in the 2021 Resilient Master Plan.

- ▶ **B-4:** Support mixed-use housing development for all household types and abilities where appropriate and in accordance with the neighborhood character, not to detract from the local economy or amenities.
- ▶ **C-2:** Consider adopting a Town Center Overlay District using the new Mixed Use Village District bylaw to create incentives for desired town center uses such as office, commercial, retail, residential and civic uses
- ▶ **C-8:** Improve condition and accessibility of sidewalks and crosswalks throughout the town center and along the streets leading to the rotary.
- ▶ **C-9:** Consider expanding the Rail Trail both north to Springfield and south to Connecticut enhancing North Main Street
- ▶ **D-9:** Plan for Affordable Housing with creation of Housing Production Plan and submit to the Massachusetts Department of Housing and Community Development for approval

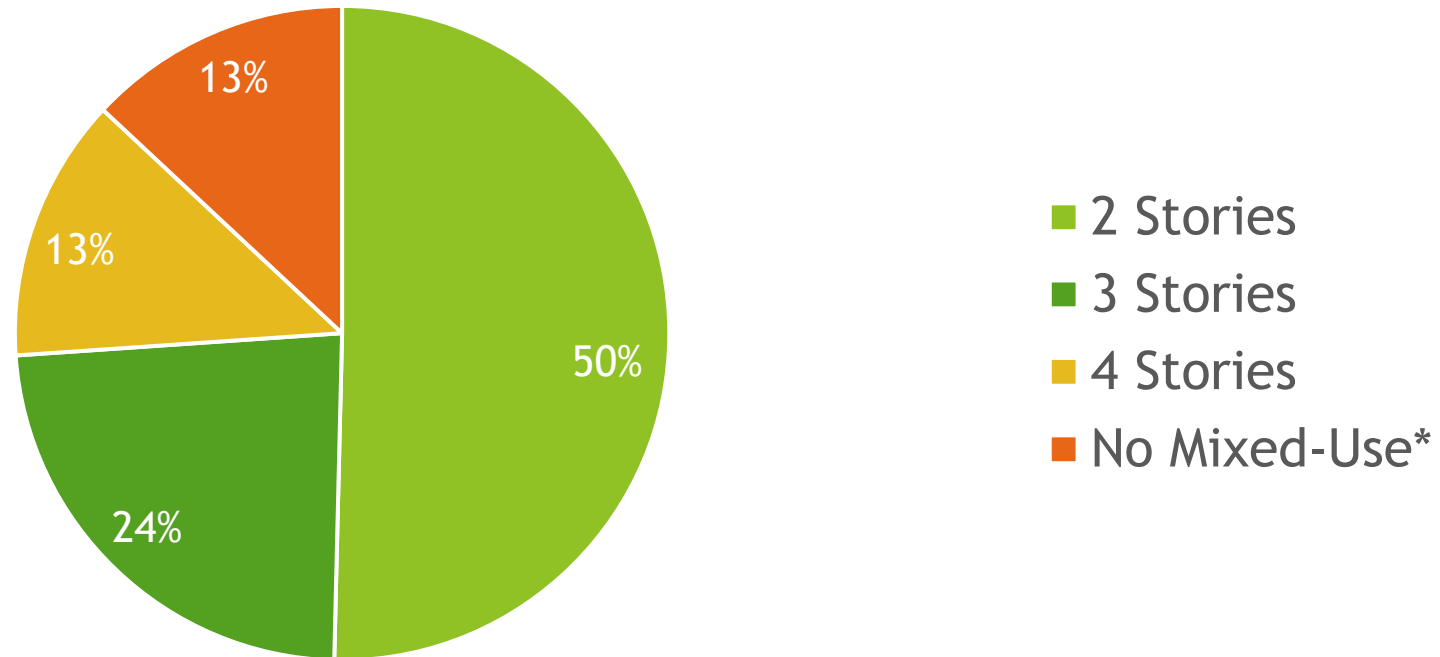

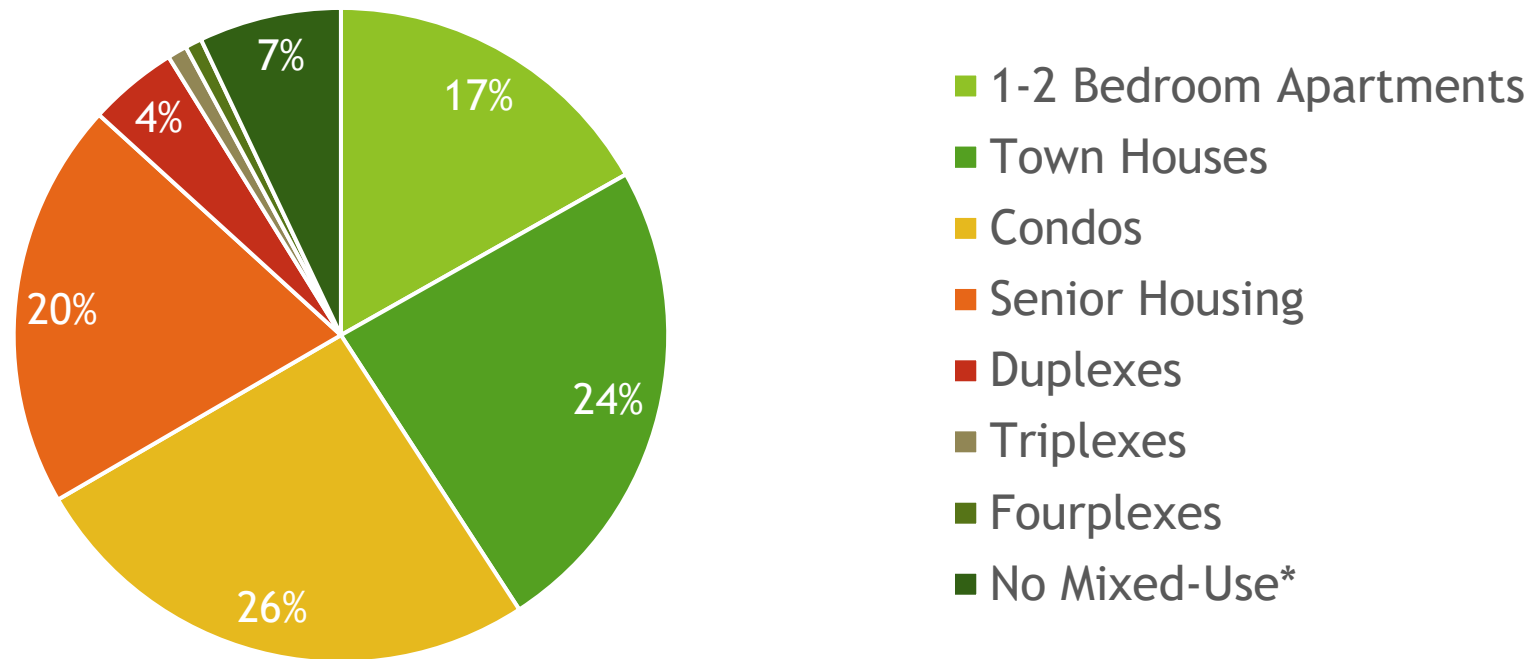
Mixed-use building height maximum



*this response was not an option in the survey but is reflected in responses to the open ended question where some expressed their opposition to this question

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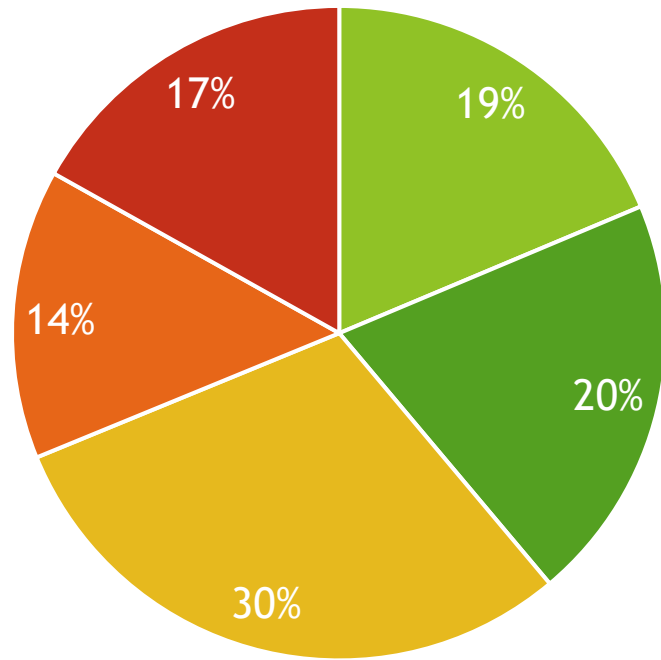
Types of Housing in Center Town Mixed-Use



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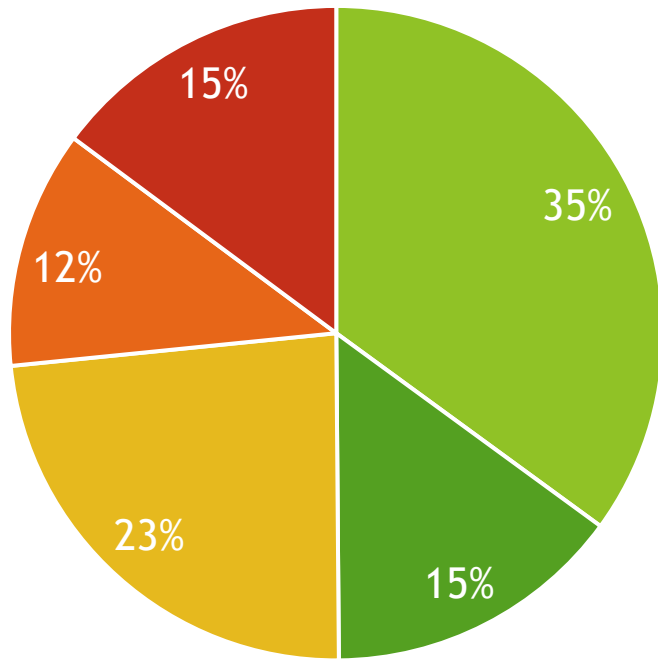
Parking in Center of Town is sufficient

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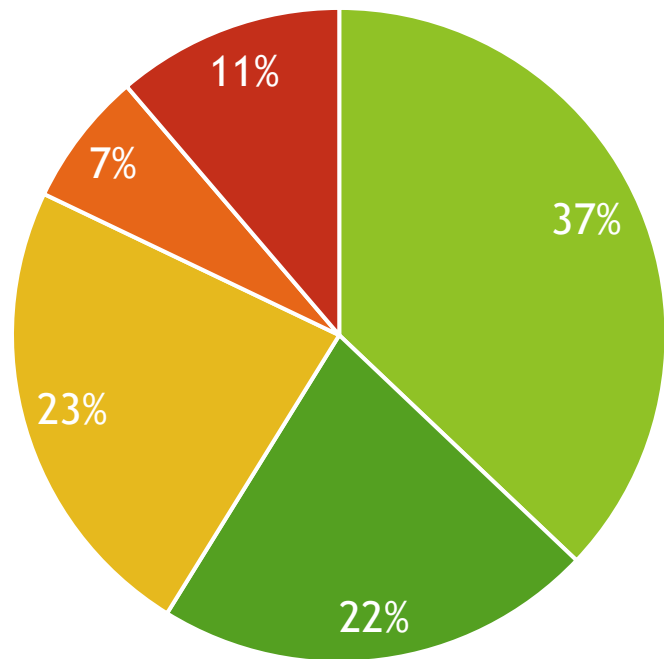
Electric vehicle charging should be available in future developments

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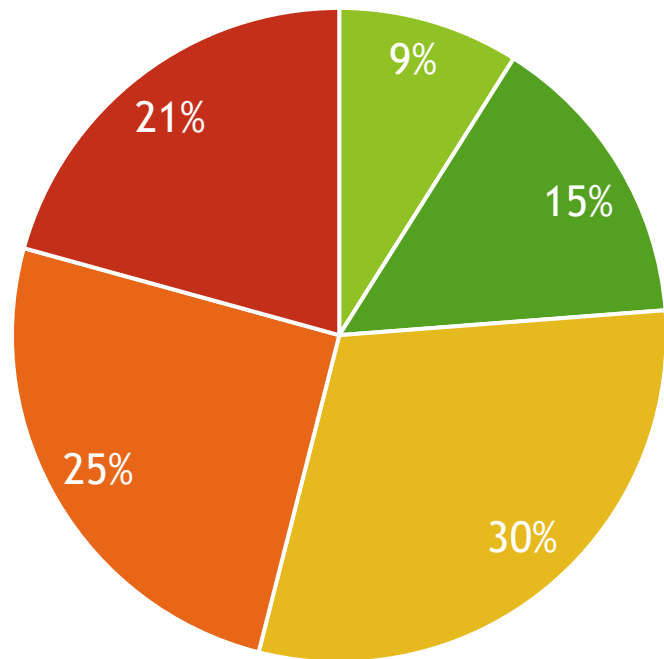
East Longmeadow should allow accessory dwelling units

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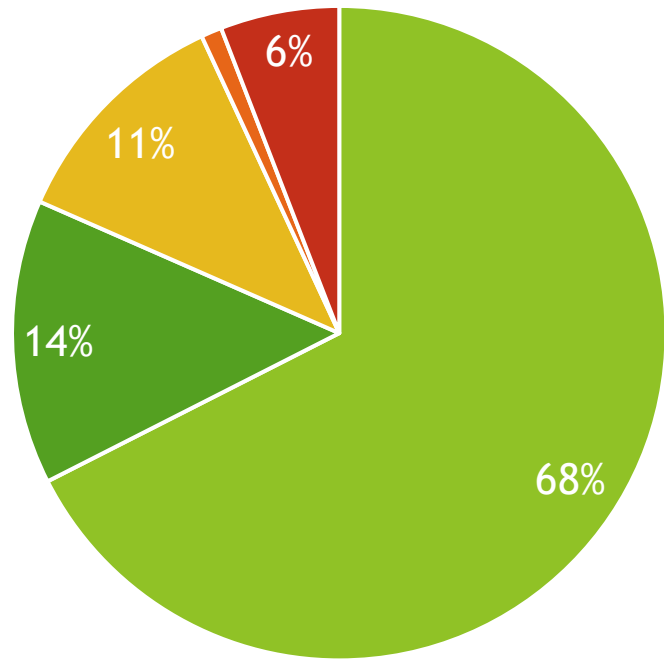
Center of Town is safe and convenient for pedestrians/cyclists
